Recommendation: Ratification of quote from JAG Construction Company to fill-in the dirt strips along W. Wyatt Earp in the Right-of-Way. It is staffs recommendation to accept the quote from JAG Construction Company for \$ 33,855.00. JAG Construction Company plans to start as soon as possible and have the project completed by July 29, 2011.

Background: In many areas along W. Wyatt Earp Blvd. from 14th Ave. to Matt Down Ln. an area between the sidewalk and R/W and or parking lot curbs remained unfinished after the KDOT road project. These areas were not included in the KDOT project. It has been decided that these areas need to be filled in with colored concrete.

Justification: This project will give W. Wyatt Earp a finished look. It will also reduce maintenance required along Wyatt Earp.

Financial Considerations: The construction of this project will cost \$33,855.00. Funding of this project will be from the Special Street Funds which has already been approved.

Purpose/Mission: The completion of this project will finish the work done on our street infrastructure. It will also help appearance of this corridor.

Legal Considerations: By approving the bid with JAG Construction Company the City will enter into a contract with JAG Construction Company and be responsible for payments for the completed work.


