*Subject: Motion to Temporarily Allow Consumption of Alcoholic
Beverages in Eisenhower Park*

Agenda Item: Consent Calendar

Recommendation: I recommend a motion to allow the consumption of alcoholic beverages on a temporary basis for a private function at a City park.

Background: The City of Dodge City's ordinances has a prohibition against the sale, service or consumption of cereal malt beverages or alcoholic beverage on city property unless there is a specific ordinance exempting a location. The ordinance reads that certain city-owned property is exempted from this prohibition and other property be exempted as determined from time to time by duly adopted motion of the City Commission. We have had a request use Eisenhower Park by Mike Doll for a musical event/birthday party on August 18, 2012 from noon to midnight. He has asked if the City would consider allowing the consumption of alcoholic beverages during the event at the park location.

Justification: The City has had similar requests in the past for allowing consumption or sale on city property and has granted this request at Eisenhower Park for the same kind of event. In the past, we have allowed it for a limited time period in a specific location with proper licensing. In this instance, since they will not be selling the beverages, there will be no additional licenses required. The ordinance allows the prohibition to be exempted upon motion of the City Commission. Upon approval by the City Commission, we will limit the time and require that the premises be cleaned.

Financial Considerations: None

Purpose/Mission: Work with the community for a safe and inviting environment.

Recommendation: I recommend the approval of Ordinance No. 3543 and 3544

Background: **Ordinance No. 3543** adopts the “2012 Edition of the Standard Traffic Ordinance” by reference. The changes made to this code during the 2012 legislature include the following:

Section 1. Definitions.

Section 30 Driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs; penalties

Section 30.1 Driving commercial motor vehicle under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs; penalties

Section 30.2.1 Refusal to submit to alcohol or drug test

Section 194 Driving while license canceled, suspended or revoked; penalty

Section 195.1 Operation of a motor vehicle when a habitual violator.

Ordinance No. 3544 adopts the “2012 Edition of the Uniform Public Offense Code” by reference. The changes made to the Uniform Public Offense Code during the 2012 legislative session include the following:

Section 1.1 Definitions

Section 2.2. Conspiracy

Section 3.1.1 Domestic Battery

Section 3.8 Violation of protection from abuse order

Section 3.8.1 Violation of protective order

Section 5.6 Purchase or possession of cigarettes or tobacco products by a minor.

Section 5.7 Selling, giving or furnishing cigarettes or tobacco products to a minor

Section 6.25 Unlawfully buying scrap metal

Section 7.2 Interference with a law enforcement officer

Section 7.3 Escape from custody

Section 7.7 Simulating legal process

Section 10.9 Carrying concealed explosives

Section 10.10 Endangerment

Section 10.20 Unlawfully obtaining a prescription-only drug

Section 10.24 Smoking prohibited

Section 10-26 Smoking prohibited, penalties

Justification: Each year the State Legislature passes numerous laws that affect the laws of the State as well as those of the individual cities. The League of Kansas Municipalities compiles a small booklet which incorporates all of the laws in Kansas that deal with public offenses and traffic offenses. These are the “Uniform Public Offense Code” and the Standard Traffic Ordinance”. Cities are allowed to adopt these codes by reference, so the entire code is not included in the adopting ordinance and is not published in the local paper. Each employee that deals with any of these codes or

ordinances is furnished a book to reference when necessary, to cite persons with violations of the ordinances. I have three of each of these books in my office for your review.

Financial Considerations: The cost of the booklets for the pertinent employees' use is approximately \$1,000.

Purpose/Mission: Ensure the City is up to date on all of the laws passed in the State of Kansas as well as make sure all employees have easy access to these laws.

Legal Considerations: None

ORDINANCE NO. 3543

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF DODGE CITY, KANSAS; INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE FOR KANSAS CITIES, EDITION 2012" AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 3523

Be it Ordained by the Governing Body of the City of Dodge City:

Section 1: INCORPORATING STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE. There is hereby incorporated by Reference for the purpose of regulating traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Dodge City, Kansas, that certain standard traffic ordinance known as the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities," Edition of 2012, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka Kansas. No fewer than three copies of said Uniform Public Offense Code shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 3543" and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance, and filed with the City Clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours. The police department, municipal judge and all administrative departments of the city charged with enforcement of the ordinance shall be supplied, at the cost of the city, such number of official copies of such Standard Traffic Ordinance similarly marked, as may be deemed expedient.

Section 2: TRAFFIC INFRACTIONS AND TRAFFIC OFFENSES.

- (a) An ordinance traffic infraction is a violation of any section of this ordinance that prescribes or requires the same behavior as that prescribed or required by a statutory provision that is classified as a traffic infraction in K.S.A. 8-2118.
- (b) All traffic violations which are included within this ordinance, and which are not ordinance traffic infractions, as defined in subsection (a) of this section shall be considered traffic offenses.

Section 3: REPEAL. Ordinance No. 3523 is hereby repealed.

Section 4: EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official City newspaper.



Agenda Item: New Business

Recommendation: Approve proposal from JAG Construction, for the construction of 14th Avenue Reconstruction Project in the amount of \$219,239.28.

Background: This project was slated for construction as part of the 2012 Street Program which was approved by the Commission earlier this year. This project will also finish the pavement replacement on 14th from US56 to Iron Road.

Justification: This project will maintain the street infrastructure and extend the service life of the street.

Financial Considerations: The construction of the 14th Avenue Reconstruction Project will cost \$219,239.28. Funding of this project will be through General Obligation Bonds (GOB) and Special Streets which have already been approved.

Purpose/Mission: The completion of this project will maintain our street infrastructure in an acceptable condition and extend the life of street repaired under this project.

Legal Considerations: By approving the bid with JAG Construction Company, the City will enter into a contract with JAG Construction Company, and be responsible to make payments to JAG Construction Company, Inc., for the completed work.
